- 1. **Call Meeting to Order:** Chair Robinson called the meeting to order at 3:00p.m.

- 3. AARESTAD MAKE A MOTION; SECOND BY SHERFINSKI TO APPROVE THE MARCH 27, 2023 BROADBAND TASK FORCE MEETING MINUTES. MOTION CARRIED.
- 4. Educational Presentations and Committee Discussion:
 - A. Update on Grant Funded Broadband Projects
 - Frontier (PSC 2022) Todd Kruse Currently 17 wire centers involved within their project.
 Completion for step one at the end of June 2023. Construction to start July 1 for outside plan
 engineering with a physical start Sept 2023. Scheduled completion for Sept 2024. A map outlining the
 project was requested.
 - 2. Bug Tussel (PSC 2022) Ashley Bolden Didn't have any updates. She offered to get answers to any questions. The quarterly report is in the packet. Supervisor Robinson added information from his previous meeting.
 - 3. Charter (RDOF) Celeste Flynn– Shared a map of projected completions by Aug 2023. An approximately 2000 residents can have access by this time. This work is in Western Marathon County.
 - B. Status Report on Bug Tussel's Project No report to add.
 - C. FCC Fabric Map Challenges The language in the agreements is difficult for local governments to follow. Marathon County is working with corporation counsel to get the agreements complete. The county can do bulk challenges, however getting information from vendor has created challenges. It has been very difficult for individuals to complete the challenges.
 - D. Frontier 2023 PSC Applications The Frontier grant for Marathon County was not addressed at a recent meeting.
- 5. Policy Discussion and Possible Action:
 - A. Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program
 - 1. Planning Grant– There is 42.5 billion available nationwide. Wisconsin will be receiving between \$800 million and 1.1 billion. Marathon County has partnered with Centergy for a planning grant for

- 2. Are we on target to get all towers up this year?


"All" is kind of a moving target. The original proposal was for 18 towers. There are 10 currently online, 6 are standing and awaiting equipment/connections, and 2 that need to be stacked. All 18 of those will assuredly be online before the end of the year.

We also have another 4 that are tracking for the Q4/2023 or Q1/2024, and 2 that we have had difficulty finding a candidate for.


Our expectation is that we will have 22 active sites by Q2/2024.

3. It appears that the FCC fabric broadband map indicates that we provide 100% coverage in the county; is this claim accurate?

John and Mitch discussed this. From what Mitch has been able to see, the FCC data does not show that we cover all of Marathon County. If we can identify the issue, we would be happy to address it.



- 4. Where is conduit, fiber, and where is fiber live?
 - a. Conduit is installed in all areas marked in orange and yellow (see below)
 - b. Fiber is installed in the yellow area
 - c. Fiber is not live yet. Final connections are being made in the yellow area.
