- 1. **Call Meeting to Order:** Chair Robinson called the meeting to order at 3:01pm.
- 2. Public Comments (15 Minute limit) none
- 3. GISSELMAN MAKE A MOTION; SECOND BY SHERFINSKI TO APPROVE THE AUGUST 28, 2023 BROADBAND TASK FORCE MEETING MINUTES. MOTION CARRIED.

4. Educational Presentations and Committee Discussion:

- A. Update on Grant Funded/Assisted Broadband Projects
 - 1. Charter Randy Shared a map of their current status of completion and upcoming buildouts.
 - 2. Frontier Todd Completing two projects outside the county that has been priority for staff. They will have revised schedule in the 4th quarter. They will still be in the two year completion guidelines.
 - 3. Bug Tussel Scott They are working best they can to get the towers up and fiber in the ground. Inflation costs have been prohibitive. 16 towers have been lit with 4 more to go. No fiber is live yet but there is some in the ground. There is a request for a status update for the reasons they are behind in the project completion by the end of the week.
- B. Broadband Support Position Update There were two applications for the position. There will be phone screen interviews this week.
- C. Update on Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) State Funding, Planning, and Timelines
 Chairman Robinson reviewed the BEAD information provided in the packet.

5. Policy Discussion and Possible Action:

- A. PSC Capital Projects Fund \$42 million This is due November 7. There will be meeting in the future with the ISPs to determine who will be interested in the grant application.

 - 2. Capital Projects Fund Broadband Infrastructure Program (in packet)
- B. Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program We are still waiting for the initial plan. Preston provided a map of housing points for the county to be used for data overlays to determine where the largest underserved and unserved areas are. Discussion of how to use the maps without violating privacy agreements. There will also be work with the area school districts.
- C. Process for determining priorities for future broadband expansion efforts the task force will look to use confidential information and the maps from CPZ to better determine unserved and underserved areas and anchor institutions.






Broadband Gaps

The numbers are constantly changing a little bit as things get refined and challenges resolved, but here's a summary table to make things easier for you from the May 30 refresh of the National Broadband Map. Note that these are BEAD definitions of service, which are 100/20+ by a wireline or licensed fixed wireless for **served**, 25/3 to 100/20 by wireline or licensed fixed wireless for **underserved**, and less than 25/3 by wireline or licensed fixed wireless or unlicensed fixed wireless of any speed for **unserved**. Sum no coverage and unserved for the actual total unserved amount. "BSL" is a broadband serviceable location.











Charter

Fiber is placed in conduit and sections are spliced together.


CONNECTIONS


40+ Miles In-Progress

Via the Rural Utilities Service

Private Activity Bonds \$0.6B

Authorizes State and local governments to use private activity bonds for rural broadband





Broadband Equity Access Deployment Program

\$1,055,823,573.71

Every Wisconsinite has access to reliable, affordable, high speed internet.

- •Highest priority: unserved households and businesses lacking 25/3 Mbps.
- •Eligible: underserved households and businesses lacking 100/20 Mbps.
- •Also eligible: community anchor institutions lacking 1 Gbps, and other digital equity and adoption activities.
