1. Call Meeting to Order

The agenda being properly signed and posted, and the presence of a quorum, the meeting was called to order at 2:00pm by Chair Seubert in the Large Conference Room, 210 River Drive, Wausau, WI 54403

4. Educational Presentations / Outcome Monitoring Reports and Possible Action

A. Operations Update: Compactor, Area B Closure, RNG

Director Hagenbucher provided updates including that the compactor bid will not be sole source and status on the Viridi install.

- B. Presentation and Discussion with Foth Environmental
 - i. Audit of Marathon Portage Shawano Regional Solid Waste Agreement
 - ii. Review of Solid Waste Financials

Outlined within agreement that this audit will occur. Group defined goals of the audit and Foth went through what is required to be completed as part of the agreement and the audit. There have been inconsistencies with the requirements in the agreement which have made it difficult to determine the shared costs amongst the three counties. Mike provided the 3-year review of financials. Bottom line, revenues are not covering expenses, but some of that is linked to long-term care and closure needs.

4 observations:

- Landfill capacity is being used at faster rate than capital costs are being amortized.
- Annual operating losses have not allowed for full recovery of depreciation and amortization of capital costs. Results in lack of funding for equipment replacement and future cell construction.
- Insufficient cash resources currently exist to finance all the landfill closure and long-term care liabilities.

 Sub-funds separated into 9 sub funds for landfill closure. Inconsistencies in how they are accounted for/mapped.

Foth went through suggestions for setting up annual budgeting going forward. SWD is drafting 2025 budget right now. Rates and fees increases will be proposed to SWMB and ERC in September. Reconciliation and site down will be needed amongst counties every year to determine each year if recovery was over or under what was needed.

This has been an oversight for many years and trying to make improvements right now. SWD will come back with implementation plan and rates and fees increase back to SWMB and looking for support.

5. <u>Policy Issues Discussion and Committee Determination to the County Board for its</u> Consideration and Possible Action –

A. Vault Toilet for CWOCC – Requesting Partial Support

SWMB leaning toward keeping portable vs. this vault toilet. If CWOCC abandons the toilet, it would become SWD to manage. Now is not right time to take on extra costs.

<u>ACTION:</u> MOTION / SECOND BY BRIMMER/DRABEK TO SUPPORT THE IDEA AND PROVIDE IN-KIND INSTALLATION SUPPORT ONLY. MOTION CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE, NO DISSENT.

B. 2025 FTE Request for RNG support position

Position request is related to tuning gas wells. The position would back up the one person that does it now, so that we don't experience gaps in tuning gas wells. The tuning leads to higher efficiency and more revenue, which means the position will pay for itself.

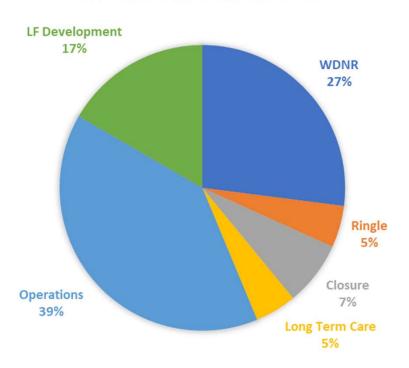

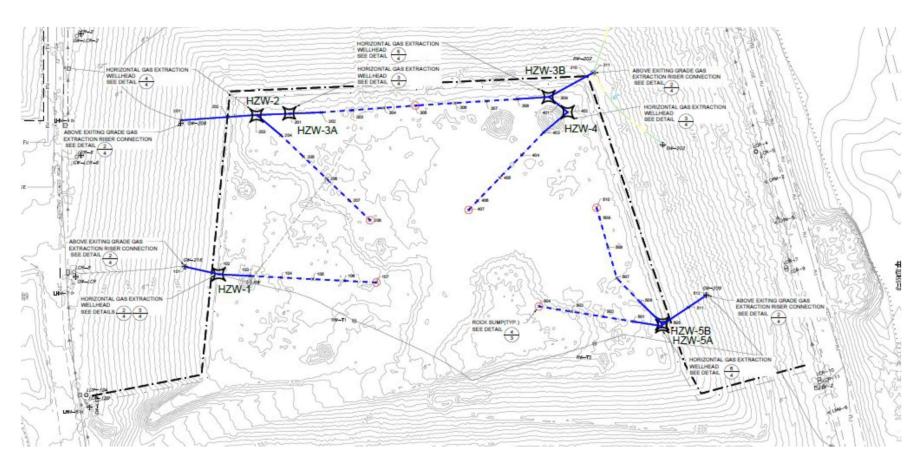
