What does this really mean for our families???





NIVD Cases

These cases receive financial management services but are ineligible for case management. Several of the services are not eligible for state or federal funding.



Services:

- Entering court orders where the parent is ordered to pay through the Trust Fund into the KIDS system.
- Working with employers to withhold income for support payments.
- Processing payments and ensuring money moves through the system properly.
- Providing information regarding payments, payment history, account statements, and direction to resources.
- Addressing court order discrepancies and clarifications.
- Identifying and correcting errors in payment processing.



IVD Cases

These cases receive financial and case management services.

We provide a broad array of services that assist in reducing childhood poverty rates, establishing parental rights and time, ensuring children have access to health care and promotes the involvement of parents and families in the lives of their children.

- Support Order Modification

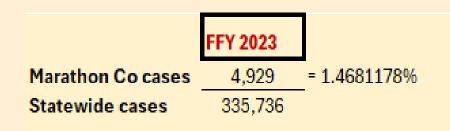

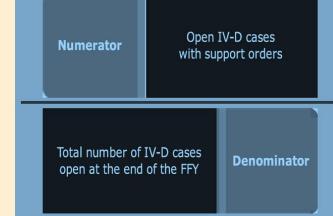

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Unearned Funds Allocation

Difference between actual award and total eligible amount when full funding is not achieved



- Marathon County earned 1.6005148% of the State's total funding available to child support counties.
- Marathon County had \$9,612 in unearned funds.
- The total unearned amount of funds across the state = \$3,353,659.
- Total award to Marathon County \$ 3,353,659 x 1.6005148% =

\$53,676.



<u>Bonus Incentive</u> Medical Support

- Total of \$300,000 GPR available each State fiscal year.
- Purpose is to reward county CSAs that find private insurance for Medicaid children.
- Reward is also eligible for matching funds at 66%.
- 64.24% of our cases had private insurance in place and we will receive additional incentive funding of \$14,683.

What is Next in FY 2025?

Focus on increasing our performance in all categories.

Increasing community education about our program.

Continue to integrate successful ELEVATE components into the "standardized" approach to child support services.
