Community Health Improvement Plan and the Community Health Assessment; communicable disease surveillance, investigation, and control; maternal child health, environmental health, chronic disease, and injuries; and birth to three.

Wis. Stat. § 251.02(1) indicates in counties with a population of less than 500,000, unless a county board establishes a city-county health department under sub. (1m) jointly with the governing body of a city or establishes a multiple county health department under sub. (3) in conjunction with another county, the county board shall establish a single county health department, which shall meet the requirements of this chapter. The county health department shall serve all areas of the county that are not served by a city health department that was established prior to January 1, 1994, by a town or village health department established under sub. (3r) or by a multiple municipal local health department sub. (3t). No governing body of a city may establish a city health department 1, 1994.

Wis. Stat. § 250.03 (1) (L) provides that the department (the state) shall perform or facilitate the performance of all of the following services and functions:

- 1. Monitor the health status of populations to identify and solve community health problems.
- 2. Investigate and diagnose community health problems and health hazards.
- 3. Inform and educate individuals about health issues.
- 4. Mobilize public and private sector collaboration and action to identify and solve health problems.
- 5. Develop policies, plans, and programs that support individual and community health efforts.
- 6. Enforce statutes and rules that protect health and ensure safety.
- 7. Link individuals to needed personal health services.
- 8. Assure a competent public health workforce.
- 9. Evaluate effectiveness, accessibility, and quality of personal and populationbased health services.
- 10. Provide research to develop insights into and innovative solutions for health problems.

State DHS facilitates the performance of these services through the delivery of services/programs by Marathon County Health Department. The state conducts periodic reviews to ensure compliance. The public health department also meets the requirements of Wisconsin State Statutes, chapter 250-255.

Required services of local health departments are further explained by Chapter DHS 140, which lists the requirements for the level of health department.

Level I health departments must provide the following:

- Surveillance and investigation of local health issues
- Communicable disease control including education, monitoring, and prevention
- Chronic disease prevention
- Human health hazard control
- Policy and planning support
- Leadership and organizational competency regarding health issues to local partners and stakeholders
- Public Health nursing services

Level II health departments must comply with the requirements for a level I while also providing:

- Support and leadership to address community needs
- Evaluating health services
- Annual performance evaluations
- Quality Improvement activities

Level III health departments must comply with the requirements for a level I, II and III, which also includes:

- Data collection
- Providing public health expertise to local government stakeholders
- Identify and address population health issues
- Establish and implement an environmental health program
- Quality Improvement activities on individual and department levels
- Evaluation of collaborative efforts to assess, develop services

Summary of services provided in Children Services includes: child protection access, assessment and ongoing services; youth justice intake and ongoing services; emergency on-call services; Coordinated Family Services (CFS), Children's Long Term Support (CLTS) waivers, Family Centered Treatment (FCT), Comprehensive Community Services (CCS) and assessment/referral. As well as stepparent adoptions, day care certifications, foster parent licensing, independent living services and purchased services (foster care, short term shelter care, kinship care, group home, residential care, corrections, secure custody, etc..).

Wis. Stat. Ch. 48 is the Children's Code and Wis. Stat. Ch. 938 is the Juvenile Justice Code.

Wis. Stat. § 48.56 requires each county having a population of less than 500,000 shall provide child welfare services through its county department. Each county department shall employ personnel who devote all or part of their time to child welfare services. Whenever possible, these personnel shall be social workers certified under Ch. 457.

Wis. Stat. § 48.57 (1) indicates that each county department shall administer and expend such amounts as may be necessary out of any moneys which may be appropriated for child welfare purposes by the county board of supervisors or by the legislature, which may be donated by individuals or private organizations or which may be otherwise provided.

Wis. Stat. § 938.57(1) indicates that each county department shall administer and expend such amounts as may be necessary out of any moneys which may be appropriated for juvenile welfare purposes by the county board of supervisors or donated by individuals or private organizations.

Wis. Stat. § 51.437 indicates that the county board of supervisors has the primary governmental responsibility for the well-being of those developmentally disabled citizens residing within its county and the families of the developmentally disabled insofar as the usual resultant family stresses bear on the well-being of the developmentally disabled citizen. This primary governmental responsibility is limited to the programs, services and resources that the county board of supervisors is reasonably able to provide within the limits of available state and federal funds and of county funds required to be appropriated to match state funds.

Wis. Stat. § 46.272 governs the Children's Community Options Program. This statutory section requires the department to establish a children's community options program with the main purpose of providing a coordinated approach to supporting families who have a child with a disability. Individual counties must determine what shall be done to meet these responsibilities in a way that adequately complies with the law. The burden of demonstrating that those responsibilities have been met to an adequate degree falls upon the county. The services, therefore, are not identical in each county even though the same basic mandate exists.

Children's Long-Term Support (CLTS) waivers provide the county access to State and Federal funding to serve the health and safety needs of children in the County. In many instances, these health and safety needs would otherwise be funded solely through local tax levy funding.

Income Maintenance Division

Wis. Stat. § 16.27 (4) indicates that a household may apply after September 30 and before May 16 of any year for heating assistance from the county department under s. 46.215 (1) (n) or 46.22 (1) (b) 4m. a. to e. or from another local governmental agency or a private nonprofit organization Funding received for this program is budgeted to cover direct operational costs.

Wis. Stat. § 49.155 (3) the county department or agency with which the department contracts under sub. (1m) to determine eligibility in a particular geographic region or for a particular Indian tribal unit shall administer child care assistance in that geographic region or for that tribal unit. Funding received for this program is budgeted to cover direct operational costs.

Wis. Stat. Ch. 49-Income Maintenance Administration. We are part of a 4 county consortium that administers medical assistance and FoodShare. The county opted to be part of this consortium, but could decide not to provide direct administration of these programs and services; however, the county would still be required to contribute local funding (tax levy) to the consortium for direct operational costs. Administration of child care assistance, as well as, program integrity, fraud and overpayment recovery efforts are also consolidated within the 10 county consortium to further increase accuracy, consistency and efficiency in the administration of these public benefits

Payments made pursuant to § 43.12 or funds necessary to directly provide county library services under Chapter 43 of the statutes are exempt from Wisconsin levy limits.

Services and materials offered by Marathon County Public Library include, but are not limited to, the following: Books and audiobooks, DVDs and video games, magazines and newspapers, eBook and eAudio collections available through digital access.

Programming including: educational classes and workshops, crafting events, music and theatre performances, movie screenings, story times, experts, authors and other speakers to lead lectures, presentations and workshops on a number of subjects; additional services at varying locations including study and meeting rooms, passport services, computers and internet access, copy/print/fax services, notary public, and material delivery for homebound patrons.

MCPL is a member of and the resource library for the Wisconsin Valley Library Service and a participant in the V-Cat consortium and the Wisconsin Public Library Consortium.

Wis. Stat. § 46.80 – The department's primary responsibility to elderly persons is to assure that all elderly and disabled persons have available and accessible a continuum of care or a wide range of community and supportive services so that they may remain in their homes and neighborhoods for as long as it is possible. The department shall be the mechanism by which governmental and nongovernmental agencies may coordinate their policies, plans and activities with regard to the aging.

Wis. Stat. § 46.82 identifies that a county board of supervisors of a county, the county boards of supervisors of 2 or more contiguous counties or an elected tribal governing body of a federally recognized American Indian tribe or band in this state may choose to administer, at the county or tribal level, programs for older individuals. Chapter 46.80 indicates that the department shall divide the state into distinct planning and service areas and designate a public or private nonprofit agency or organization as the area agency on aging for each planning and service area and we are the designated public agency.

Wis. Stat. § 46.283 identifies that a county board of supervisors may decide to apply to the department for a contract to operate a resource center.

The intergovernmental agreement creating the ADRC-CW provides that the funding allocation from each of the counties cannot be modified without the agreement of each of the county members (Langlade, Lincoln, Marathon, and Wood).

Additional Information: On behalf of Marathon County, North Central Health Care delivers services including, but not limited to, alcohol and other drug abuse outpatient services, mental health outpatient services, emergency services, adult protection services, adult community support services, comprehensive community service, psychiatrist and psychologist services, crisis, residential, inpatient, and hospitalization services.

Wis. Stat. § 51.42 identifies that the county board of supervisors has the primary responsibility for the well-being, treatment and care of the mentally ill, developmentally disabled, alcoholic and other drug dependent citizens residing within its county and for ensuring that those individuals in need of such emergency services found within its county receive immediate emergency services. This primary responsibility is limited to the programs, services and resources that the county board of supervisors is reasonably able to provide within the limits of available state and federal funds and of county funds required to be appropriated to match state funds. While counties are not directly mandated to provide crisis stabilization facilities, counties are required to provide care in the least restrictive form necessary. Stabilization facilities serve as a less-restrictive, less costly form of care for individuals discharging from an inpatient setting or as an alternative to an inpatient setting.

Wis. Stat. § 51.42(3) permits a county to meet its obligation through the creation of a multicounty community services program.

Wis. Stat. § 51.421 indicates that if funds are provided, and within the limits of the availability of funds provided under s. 51.423 (2), each county department under s. 51.42 shall establish a community support program. Each community support program shall use a coordinated case management system and shall provide or assure access to services for persons with serious

and persistent mental illness who reside within the community. Services provided or coordinated through a community support program shall include assessment, diagnosis, identification of persons in need of services, case management, crisis intervention, psychiatric treatment including medication supervision, counseling and psychotherapy, activities of daily living, psychosocial rehabilitation which may include services provided by day treatment programs, client advocacy including assistance in applying for any financial support for which the client may be eligible, residential services and recreational activities. Services shall be provided to an individual based upon his or her treatment and psychosocial rehabilitation needs.

Wis. Stat. § 51.22 indicates that except as provided in s. 51.20 (13) (a) 4. or 5., any person committed under this chapter shall be committed to the county department under s. 51.42 or 51.437 serving the person's county of residence, and such county department shall authorize placement of the person in an appropriate facility for care, custody and treatment. The county will incur the cost of these placements if it is not billable to insurance or the consumer.

Individual counties must determine what shall be done to meet these responsibilities in a way that adequately complies with the law. The burden of demonstrating that those responsibilities have been met to an adequate degree falls upon the county. The services, therefore, are not identical in each county even though the same basic mandate exists.

Comprehensive Community Services (CCS) is intended to assist individuals of all ages who are in need of ongoing services for mental illness, substance abuse disorder, or dual diagnosis beyond occasional outpatient care, but less than the intensive care provided in an inpatient setting. While CCS is not a mandated program, county-based governmental entities are the only entity in the state that can be certified.

Wis. Stat. § 55.02 identifies that the chairperson of each county board of supervisors shall designate a county department under s. 46.215, 46.22, 46.23, 51.42, or 51.437 that is providing services in the county on its own or through a joint mechanism with another county department or county to have the responsibility for planning for the provision of protective services and protective placement and for directly providing protective services.

Wis. Stat. § 46.90 requires that each county board shall designate an agency in the county as the elder-adult-at-risk agency. "Elder-adult-at-risk agency" means the agency designated by the county board of supervisors under sub. (2) to receive, respond to, and investigate reports of abuse, neglect, self-neglect, and financial exploitation under sub. (4).

*There is no state statute that mandates a county must own or operate a nursing home, adult day services, housing programs, sober living, or aquatic therapy pool. However, should the county undertake these activities, each program area is subject to significant regulation, including through the acceptance of various funding streams (e.g., medicare/Medicaid).

Wis. Stat. § 85.21 The purpose of this section is to promote the general public health and welfare by providing financial assistance to counties providing transportation services for elderly and disabled persons, and to thereby improve and promote the maintenance of human dignity and self-sufficiency by affording the benefits of transportation services to those people who would not otherwise have an available or accessible method of transportation. The County Board of Supervisors annually authorizes this program to be delivered through a grant application. The service is delivered through both NCHC and City of Wausau Transit. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation provides for financial assistance to deliver the program.

[^]Wis. Stat. § 51.44 indicates that each county board of supervisors shall designate the appropriate county department under s. 46.21, 46.23 or 51.437, the local health department of the county or another entity as the local lead agency to provide early intervention services. This chapter goes on to read that the department (the state) shall promulgate rules for the statewide implementation of the program. North Central Health Care currently delivers this program through a contract with Marathon County Special Education, which is located on the Lake View Drive Campus.

Counties are not mandated to directly provide Solid Waste management and recycling services; however, counties are permitted to engage in these activities, which can provide substantial benefits to local municipalities and residents. Should a county elect to provide said services it becomes subject to a wide variety of state and federal regulations (e.g., air permit, wetland management, engineering, gas management, and groundwater testing).

In addition to solid waste management and site operational programs, Marathon County Solid Waste Department provides a number of related services, including but not limited to Household Hazardous Waste Collection and Management; Agricultural Plastics Recycling, Home Composting, Street Sweeping exemption, Medication Drop Box and Sharps Management, and Municipal Recycling education).

Marathon County has a contractual obligation to provide landfill capacity and disposal to Shawano and Portage Counties through 2032. Marathon County also recently entered into a Gas Purchase Agreement and corresponding site lease with a third party relating to the processing and conversion of landfill gas into energy.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING 2024 BUDGET PRIORITIES AND GUIDELINES

WHEREAS, Marathon County is an economically diverse county with a growing population and variety of rural, suburban, and urban communities; and

WHEREAS, County staff provided background information on historical revenues and expenses at the April 20th and 25th meetings of the Board of Supervisors and the May 10th meeting of the Human Resource and Finance Committee meeting; and

WHEREAS, revenue limitations by the State continue to require tough decision prioritizing which expenses will be covered with limited revenues; and

WHEREAS, prudent financial management and maintenance of fund balance reserves are essential to the long-term fiscal health of the county and the retention of a strong credit rating; and

WHEREAS, the Marathon County Board of Supervisors is sensitive to the nature of the tax burden on the residents of Marathon County, and prioritizes a stable, sustainable tax levy rate;

WHEREAS, the Marathon County Board adopted a budget development timeline that calls for the establishment of budget priority guidelines for the County Administrator to consider when putting together a budget recommendation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Marathon County Board of Supervisors hereby establishes the following categorical priority guidelines for the County Administrator to consider, in conjunction with the direction to maintain the county's long-term fiscal health and strong credit rating, when creating the 2024 budget:

- 1 Structural Deficit
- 2 Employee Compensation
- 3 Health Insurance
- 4 New Positions
- 5 Operating Expenses

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the seven (7) standing committees of Marathon County are hereby called upon to continue the review of the 2023 mandated services report and the rate and fee documents during the ensuing months to develop additional recommendations for consideration by the Board of Supervisors in the 2024 budget development and approval process.

1. **SUMMARY**. On March 3, 2023, the Wisconsin Elections Commission (WEC) approved the allocation of federal funds for an absentee ballot envelope subgrant program. This subgrant is provided to partially offset the costs jurisdictions incur purchasing the redesigned absentee ballot envelopes (EL-120 and EL-122) planned for approval on August 4, 2023.

2. BACKGROUND.

The bipartisan Commission unanimously directed the creation of new absentee ballot envelope designs in order to ensure compliance with the law. The old envelope designs do not conform with guidance from recent court orders and do not fully comply with all statutory requirements. Furthermore, the old envelope designs do not incorporate design features (adopted in other states) that make them easily identifiable to the U.S. Postal Service. For these reasons, the Commission, on April 28 and again on June 1, unanimously determined that the current EL-120 and EL-122 shall <u>not</u> be used in 2024.

To partially offset the cost of adopting new envelope designs, the WEC will disburse up to \$600,000 of Federal funds through the approved 2023 Absentee Ballot Envelope Subgrant Program. Each jurisdiction may receive an award calculated proportionally based on their estimated January 1, 2022, voting age population as determined by the Department of Administration Demographic Services Center.¹ The minimum award is \$20.00. A list of award amounts is attached as Appendix A.

- 3. **AUTHORIZED USES.** All funds received must be expended to purchase the redesigned absentee envelopes which includes both the EL-120 and EL-122.
- 4. **HOW DO JURISDICTIONS APPLY?** An authorized representative of each jurisdiction must complete and return a 2023 Absentee Ballot Envelope Subgrant Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

I. PARTIES

The parties to this Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MOU" or "agreement") are the Wisconsin Elections Commission (hereinafter referred to as the "WEC" or the "Commission") and the (<u>City</u>) (Village) (Town) of <u>Sec atlacked list</u> in <u>Marathon</u> County, Wisconsin. The Commission is the state agency providing an election security subgrant of federal funds to the city, village, or town. The City, Village or Town identified above is the entity receiving a local election security subgrant from the Commission and is referred to herein as the "receiving jurisdiction." By signing and dating this agreement, the participating City, Village, or Town agrees to the terms of this agreement with the Commission.

II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to set forth the requirements that cities, villages and towns must meet to be eligible to receive an absentee ballot envelope subgrant from the Commission and the requirements for the use of the funds. The subgrant program is funded by the federal HAVA Election Security Grant which was authorized by the U.S. Congress under Section 101 of the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (P.L. 107-252) (HAVA) and provided for in the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 (Public Law 117-328) and issued by the federal Election Assistance Commission. The purpose of the federal grant is to "improve the administration of elections for Federal office, including to enhance election technology and make election security improvements to the systems, equipment and processes used in federal elections" (CFDA Number 90.404; Federal Award Identification Number (FAIN) EAC-ELSEC18WI).

The purpose of the subgrant is to help improve overall election security of federal elections statewide by providing cities, villages, and towns across the State of Wisconsin with federal election security funds to safeguard and secure the integrity of the absentee voting process in federal elections.

III. SUBGRANT PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

A. Introduction

The Commission's Election Security Subgrant Program ("subgrant") is intended to fund jurisdictions purchasing redesigned absentee ballot envelopes. Each jurisdiction may receive an amount determined based on their estimated January 1, 2022, voting age population as determined by the Department of Administration Demographic Services Center.¹ All funds received must be expended to purchase the redesigned absentee ballot envelopes or returned to the Commission.

B. Envelope Redesign.

At the Commission's February 2, 2023, meeting, WEC staff were directed to develop a timeline to implement a new absentee ballot envelope package that would allow for the Commission to approve the design no later than its September 20, 2023, meeting. The absentee ballot envelope package for voters includes two envelopes:

- EL-120: Absentee Ballot Mailer Envelope (outside envelope going to voter)
- EL-122: Official Absentee Ballot Application/Certification (inside envelope returning to clerk)

These envelopes were redesigned to ensure compliance with recent court decisions and the Wisconsin statutes. Old envelopes are not compliant with the law, and the Wisconsin Elections Commission unanimously voted not to permit their continued use, starting in 2024.

At the Commission's March 3, 2023, meeting, the Commission directed staff to allocate \$600,000 of federal funds towards an Absentee Ballot Envelope subgrant program, to partially offset the cost of transitioning to new absentee ballot envelopes now under development. The absentee ballot envelope performs several functions – each essential to the security of the voter's choice, and the integrity of the wider electoral process. A successful transition to the new design is therefore in the interest of all participants.

IV. FUNDING

- A. Commission staff will award subgrants based on receipt of a signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Jurisdictions may receive a proportional amount of available subgrant funds based on their 2022 estimated voting age population as outlined in Appendix A. The minimum award is \$20.00.
- B. All funds received must be expended to purchase the redesigned absentee ballot envelopes. A county purchasing envelopes on behalf of a municipality may receive a subgrant award, however only one award will be granted per municipality. Any unused funds must be returned to the Commission by December 31, 2024.
- C. Subgrant period: March 3, 2023 December 31, 2024. All costs must be incurred, including goods received, during this project period. Bids, proposals, or purchase orders are not adequate for this subgrant.

- D. Documentation: Receipts or invoices for all subgrant expenditures, showing date and amount for all funds expended, must be retained by requesting jurisdictions for a minimum of **eight years**. A standard inventory list of all items purchased using subgrant funds must be created and maintained by the jurisdiction for purposes of any state or federal audit.
- E. Request Processing: Subgrant funds will be distributed in a timely manner after the WEC receives the completed and signed MOU from the jurisdiction. Subgrant funds will be disbursed by electronic transfer to a jurisdiction's shared revenues account (if available), or via a physical check sent to a jurisdiction's shared revenues location. For questions related to the processing of subgrant reimbursements, contact the Commission's financial team via the WEC Help Desk at 608-261-2028 or <u>elections.finance@wi.gov</u>.

V. SUBGRANT PROGRAM DEADLINES

To help increase overall election security across the state, the election subgrant program has established the following deadlines:

New Envelope Design Available: August/September, 2023

Application (MOU) Deadline: June 30, 2024

Return Unused Funds Deadline: December 31, 2024

VI. COMPLIANCE MONITORING, CERTIFICATION, DOCUMENTATION AND AUDIT

A. Certification.

The receiving jurisdiction shall certify (by completing the MOU) that information provided is true and correct; it has complied with all terms of the subgrant; the election security subgrant funds will be used to meet the terms of the subgrant, including to increase the accessibility of federal elections; and that any falsification of information related to the subgrant could subject the jurisdiction official to civil or criminal penalties.

B. Documentation.

The receiving jurisdiction shall maintain all documentation of purchases made using subgrant funds provided by the Commission for a minimum of eight years from the date of the expenditure or until the WEC authorizes destruction of said records. A standard inventory list of all items purchased using subgrant funds must be created and maintained by the jurisdiction for purposes of any state or federal audit. Such original purchasing documentation and inventory lists shall be retained by the receiving jurisdiction until the WEC authorizes the destruction of said records. Submission of copies of all purchasing documentation may be required by the WEC or federal auditors at any time.

C. Audit.

All subgrant funds received are subject to audit by the Commission and/or the federal government to ensure funds have been spent appropriately and in accordance with all applicable state and federal laws. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 5.05(11), if the federal government objects to the use of any funds provided to a county or municipality under the subgrant, the county or municipality shall repay the amount of the subgrant to the Commission.

D. Regulations.

As the receiving jurisdiction, we further certify that we will follow all state and federal laws, including adherence to all applicable federal requirements including Office of Management and Budget (OMB) guidance: Title 2 C.F.R. 

WHEREAS, the Marathon County Sheriff's Office exists to provide a safe, secure and crime-free community through trust-building, enforcement and public safety management; and

WHEREAS, the creation of this Deputy Sheriff position in partnership with the Town of Rib Mountain is directly linked to this mission; and

WHEREAS, this position will be funded by Rib Mountain including wages for one full-time deputy along with the purchase of a vehicle and other required equipment; and

This is an additional Deputy Sheriff position being requested by the Town of Rib Mountain to augment the current Deputy Sheriff position already contracted to Rib Mountain. This is in line with the County's mission statement. A key part of the mission statement is that we will work in partnership with other partners to create opportunities to make Marathon County a preferred place to live, work, visit and do business. This position is a partnership between the Town of Rib Mountain and the Marathon County Sheriff's Office. For years leaders within the County and the Town of Rib Mountain have been approached about the need for Rib Mountain to have its own police department. Due to the size and make-up of the Town they are not required by statute to create their own police department. They however have the ability if they wish to contract with a law enforcement entity to provide specific law enforcement services for them. We currently have one full-time Deputy Sheriff assigned to the Town of Rib Mountain. The Town now wishes to enter into a larger contract for a total of two (2) dedicated Deputy Sheriff's.

The Town of Rib Mountain yields the largest number of calls of any town throughout the year. Rib Mountain is the heart of the shopping district in our county and has direct access to many recreational opportunities for our residents and visitors. Having a second dedicated Deputy contracted to the Town will bring about a great deal of consistency in our policing in Rib Mountain and will open up better lines of communication with the Town, local businesses and residents. The Deputies assigned to Rib Mountain will take on many of the community policing opportunities that we have not been able to provide in the past.

This position allows the Sheriff's Office to increase our staffing and response to areas outside of the Town of Rib Mountain during the hours the contracted deputies are working. This frees up deputies to provide better

service to those areas that we have not been able to spend time in due to our commitment to the Rib Mountain area. In addition, the contracted Deputies will be able to better serve the Rib Mountain area by having unique and consistent knowledge about current trends or incidents in Rib Mountain, stronger relationships with residents and businesses and access to the many resources at the Sheriff's Office when those additional services are needed. We believe this position will provide a higher level of service to Rib Mountain and free up resources to better serve other areas of the county.

POSITION SUMMARY:

Marathon County Sheriff's Office is pleased to announce an OPEN recruitment for Deputy Sheriffs. While we are currently accepting applications on an ongoing basis, it does not necessarily mean that there are presently open positions. Those applicants selected to participate in the next hiring assessment will be notified accordingly. Experienced law enforcement candidates are encouraged to apply and review the Lateral Entry Program agreement that allows for up to five (5) years of prior full-time service to be considered in the placement within the Deputy Sheriff pay scale and used for Paid Time Off (PTO) accruals.

Marathon County Deputy Sheriffs perform various law enforcement duties providing protection of life and property and the enforcement of federal, state and county laws and ordinances. The regular work schedule is a cycle of 4 consecutive days of work with 2 consecutive days off including weekends and holidays. The regular work day is 8 hours, 25 minutes. Officers will be assigned to one of three shifts. Deputies serve an 18 month probationary period.

QUALIFICATIONS:

High school diploma or GED plus:

- Current State of Wisconsin Sworn law enforcement officer certification; OR a minimum of 60 credits earned at an accredited college or technical school. Preference will be given to candidates with current State of Wisconsin Sworn Law Enforcement Officer certification.
- Possess a valid driver's license and driving record that meets Sheriff's Office standards.
- Minimum of 18 years of age.
- United States citizen.
- Applicants must not have been convicted of any federal felony or of any offense which if committed in Wisconsin could be punished as a felony unless the applicant has been granted an absolute and unconditional pardon.
- Applicants must not have been convicted of any misdemeanor crime of domestic violence unless the applicant has been granted an absolute and unconditional pardon.
- Must be of good character to withstand an extensive background investigation.

NEW POLICY Regarding Residency: Marathon County Deputies living outside of the county, MUST live within a 15minute response time to county line.

EXAMPLES OF WORK PERFORMED:

- Patrols an assigned area in an automobile for the purposes of preventing and discovering crimes, and enforcing all applicable laws, ordinances, and traffic regulations.
- Responds to calls for service as dispatched; provides necessary assistance to the public; takes appropriate enforcement action when necessary.
- Makes arrests after observing law violations; transports prisoners to the County Jail for booking; prepares reports on action taken for record keeping purposes and for use in courtroom presentations as necessary.
- May be required to operate intoximeter equipment in accordance with State standards and departmental policies.
- Investigates accidents, sudden deaths, suicides, and any felonies or misdemeanors which may occur in the officer's area of responsibility. Enters comments into department computers; dictates reports as required.
- Utilizes various law enforcement software to complete required forms and reports.
- Serves a variety of criminal and civil processes and arrest warrants.
- Testifies in court as needed.
- May maintain order and provide security services in courtrooms and other areas of the Courthouse.
- Attends training classes and programs as required. Required to maintain certifications in CPR, intoximeter, radar, DAAT, EVOC, PBT, and qualify semi-annually with department issued firearms.
- Develops solutions to work issues that add value for our customers.
- Maintains regular and predictable attendance.
- Positions in this classification are subject to emergency call in.
- May have occupational exposure to bloodborne pathogens. Refer to the Marathon County Sheriff's Department Exposure Control Plan for more specific information.
- Performs related work as required.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS & ABILITIES:

- Knowledge of approved principles and practices of law enforcement work and of applicable laws and ordinances.
- Knowledge of the geography and demography of assigned area.
- Knowledge of departmental rules and regulations, policies, and procedures.
- Knowledge of first aid methods and techniques.
- Knowledge of investigative techniques and practice.
- Ability to observe situations analytically and objectively, and to report and record them clearly and accurately.
- Skill in the use and care of firearms and in the safe and efficient operation of motor vehicles, as well as other departmental equipment.
- Skill to deal courteously, yet firmly and effectively, with the public in police situations, of both an adversary and non-adversary nature.
- Ability to exercise good judgment in emergency situations, to act quickly and calmly in applying appropriate techniques.
- Ability to learn thoroughly a wide variety of rules and police procedures.
- Ability to learn various law enforcement computer systems and utilize knowledge in performing required job duties.
- Skill in the use of computer software programs, functions, and operations.
- Understands the County's and department's mission, core values, plans, and priorities for the future.
- Ability to contribute to a positive work culture that fosters excellent customer service and teamwork.

COMPENSATION:

Starting hourly rate **Deputy I:** \$30.11 per hour (\$62,610 annually).

Based on a Lateral Entry Agreement, an experienced, currently-employed, full-time Wisconsin Law Enforcement Officer with a minimum of three (3) continuous years in that capacity could enter the pay scale with a maximum credit of five years of prior service, at the level of a **Deputy Sheriff III, with an hourly rate of \$34.46 (\$71,665 annually)**. This wage increase will take place immediately upon hire.

SELECTION PROCEDURE:

All candidates will be notified of their status.

1. Candidates selected for consideration will be contacted via email. As soon as dates are selected for another round of the hiring assessment and interview with Sheriff Command Staff described below, selected candidates will be emailed.

2. Complete and pass a candidate hiring assessment - The assessment will be administered at the Marathon County Sheriff's Office. It will consist of an oral interview, scenario/simulation and report-writing. Qualified applicants will be invited via e-mail to take part in the assessment at a designated date and time.

3. Interview with Sheriff's Command Staff - Upon successful completion of the hiring assessment, the top candidates will be selected for interviews with members of the Marathon County Sheriff's Office Senior Command Staff. This interview panel will consist of the Sheriff, Chief Deputy, Patrol Captain and other selected staff. Candidates will be invited via e-mail to sign up for the interviews at a designated date and time. A written background assessment may also be completed at this time.

Candidates will be notified within two (2) business days of their interview with the senior command staff of their status. Candidates will either be moved forward in the process, placed on an eligibility list, or not selected for additional consideration.

4. Candidates moving forward in the selection process will undergo an extensive background/criminal investigation: verification of education and certification, verification of employment record, background/criminal check and a driving record check.

5. Candidates offered employment will be required to submit to and pass the post-offer assessments: physical and back exam, drug screen, fingerprinting, and a psychological assessment that are paid for by Marathon County.
