## History of ACE Data Collection in Wisconsin

- ACE module first included in the Wisconsin Behavioral Risk Factor Survey (BRFS) in 2010.
- Standard BRFS methods were used
- 25,518 adults answered ACE module questions from 2011-2015

• Results weighted to represent Wisconsin's adult \*\*\* Prevention Board ti \*\* with landline and cellular telephones



















































# Help that Helps

#### Four Resilience Factors that Make a Difference They are even more powerful when we Layer Up...


- 1. Feeling social/emotional support and hope
