  - A. Imploring the Wisconsin Dep't of Transportation to Reconstruct Business Highway 51 Due to Its Horrendous Condition Between State Trunk Highway 29 in the Village of Rothschild and the Eau Claire River in the City of Schofield

<u>Discussion</u>: There was quite a bit of discussion regarding the words chosen for the resolution – namely "imploring" and "horrendous." There was also discussion regarding the fact that several legislators have been contacted previously regarding this road and they are well aware of the conditions that exist. Supervisor Robinson stated that the reason it's being addressed is because Marathon County is responsible for providing the maintenance on that stretch of road, and because of its condition, it is increasingly difficult to maintain.
