There was also the feeling that this resolution does more to divide people than act as a unifying measure. Those who spoke in favor of the resolution felt that it was imperative to the economic future of the County that we be recognized as open and inclusive to all people and see this resolution as a first step in accomplishing that goal. Some supervisors suggested that this issue be put to the voters in the form of a referendum. <u>Action</u>: None.
