- 1. Meeting Called To Order
 - a. Chief Kujawa calls the meeting to order @ 1400
- 2. Roll Call
 - a. Roll-call was taken. A quorum of <u>10</u> was present.
- 3. Approval of Minutes
 - a. Mike Puerner made the motion, second by Frank Hanousek Minutes approved
- 4. Call for Elections for Chair & Vice Chair due to Tracey Kujawa's resignation and Mike Meuret's earlier resignation, elections were held.
 - a. Phil read the rules for elections for Chair and Vice-Chair

- b. Bob Pound nominated for Chair respectfully declined
 - i. John Peralta nominated for chair no other nominations brought forward
 - ii. Motion to close nominations by Mike Puerner, Scott Parks Second
 - iii. John Peralta has been made Chair by vote
- c. Control of meeting was then turned over to John.
- d. Vice Chair Chair Peralta asks for nominations for Vice Chair
 - i. Ed & Bill were nominated by Phil

 - i. Phil requested hazmat incidents be added to the survey.
 - f. Next Steps
 - i. Next steps include the survey being sent to Towns, Darryl will work on the beginning part of the plan, begin organizing the meetings with the cities & villages, and LEPC members will be returning their ranking survey.

 - a. James Williams indicated a total of 16 plans would be completed for this year, three of them new. Nine plans have been completed so far, and were listed for the LEPC. Vote was passed to have the plans be approved by the Chair and then voted on by the LEPC as has been done historically.
