#### 1. Call to Order

#### 2. Welcome and Introductions

All were welcomed and introductions were made.

3. Public Comment – NONE

#### 4. Approve Minutes February 11, 2020 meeting

Action: Motion / Second by Thuot / Rusch to approve the February 11, 2020 minutes to reflect the following change to Item 6: It was agreed that MPO can and should be involved with issues which impact the region and urbanized area (such as water supply, wastewater, and stormwater) but, how individual communities determine to handle operational and administrative issues for providing services in their communities, or with other communities, is not something for MPO. Motion carried by voice vote, no dissent.

#### 5. 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program Amendment

<u>Discussion:</u> Mack shared that in the packet is an amendment that includes four projects for Marathon County. Opportunity Inc. has applied for 5310 funding, which is federal money for seniors with mobile disabilities, to replace three vehicles. Wheels of Independence Inc., is asking for a minivan replacement that would have a rear lift. The fourth project is a loan program for Wisconsin Automotive & Truck Education Association (WATEA) who purchase vehicles and fixes the vehicles and loans the vehicles to people in need. Also included in the packet is a list of all the projects in the state.

The number one ranked project is the Business Campus Trail – East/West Connector – City of Wausau.

# RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE AMENDMENT TO THE 2020-2023 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR THE WAUSAU METROPOLITAN AREA

- **WHEREAS,** the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission was designated the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Wausau Urbanized Area; and
- WHEREAS, in compliance with Metropolitan Transportation Planning Regulations by the U.S.

  Department of Transportation, the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning
  Commission has developed a four-year transportation improvement program (TIP)
  for the Wausau Metropolitan Area; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Transportation Improvement Program identifies transit, pedestrian/bicycle, and highway improvement projects and programs consistent with current transportation plans;
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission endorses the *Long Range Transportation Plan for the Wausau Metropolitan Area* and the *Transit Development Program for the Wausau Area Transit System,* which will be continually updated and maintained as part of the urban transportation planning process;
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission adopts the four Interstate Maintenance program funded resurfacing and polymer overlay projects on I39 and the two Federal Transit 5307 funded Telephone and Building Access projects for Metro Ride as part of the amendment to the 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program for the Wausau Metropolitan Area; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** in accordance with 23 CFR 450.336, the Wausau Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Wausau, WI urbanized area hereby certifies that the metropolitan transportation planning process is addressing the major issues facing the metropolitan planning area and is being conducted in accordance with all applicable requirements of:
  - 1. 23 U.S.C. 134 and 49 U.S.C. 5303, and this subpart;
  - 2. Sections 174 and 176 (c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act as amended (42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506 (c) and (d)) and 40 CFR part 93;
  - 3. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 USC 2000d-1) and 49 CFR part 21;
  - 4. 49 USC 5332, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, or age in employment or business opportunity;

- Section 1101(b) of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST Act) (Pub. L. 114-357) and 49 CFR Part 26 regarding the involvement of disadvantaged business enterprises in the US DOT funded projects;
- 6. 23 CFR part 230, regarding the implementation of an equal employment opportunity program on Federal and Federal-aid highway construction contracts;
- 7. The provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101 *et seq.*) and 49 CRF Parts 27, 37, and 38;
- 8. The Older Americans Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 6101, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of age in programs or activities receiving Federal financial assistance;
- 9. Section 324 of title 23, U.S.C. regarding the prohibition of discrimination based on gender; and
- 10. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and 49 CFR 27 regarding discrimination against individuals with disabilities.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Marathon County Metropolitan Planning Commission certifies that the Transportation Improvement Program contains only projects that are consistent with the transportation plan for the urban area and recommends that this document be submitted to the appropriate federal and state agencies for approval.
