MSA and the Parks Department have begun the process to update the County's Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan. MSA will be attending your joint March 5th meeting to kick-off the project. At the meeting we intend to review the following items:

- 1. Project Schedule. A copy of the project schedule is included in your packet.
- 2. Draft On-Line Community Survey. A pdf copy of the survey developed by MSA and Department Staff is included in your packet.
- 3. Community Survey Outreach Activities. A pdf copy of potential outreach activities Department Staff may conduct and associated timelines is included in your packet.
- 4. Plan to Play April 30th Public Involvement Meeting. We'll discuss the general logistics and plan for this future meeting.
- 5. Proposed Action Plan from the 2007-2012 CORP. Department Staff have reviewed the list of actions from the prior CORP and have included notes regarding those prior recommendations that have either been (1) completed, (2) not completed but should likely be carried forward into the next plan, and (3) those prior recommendations that were not completed and should likely not be carried forward into the next plan. Since our time on the 5th is limited we do not intend to go through this document in detail. We have included this information in your packet so that you can refresh yourself with the recommendations of the last plan and to inform responses to item #6 below. Future meetings can be used to discuss uncompleted projects to carry forward.
- 6. Review Park/Forestry Commissioner Survey. Following the March 5th meeting Director Polley will provide an email to the commission members that contains a link to a take an on-line survey. This survey is intended just for Park/Forestry Commission members and is not a public survey. The purpose of the survey is to gather your initial thoughts and opinions regarding issues and opportunities at each County park and desired improvements. The information you provide will supplement the feedback we receive through the public survey, public involvement meeting, etc. In short, it serves as an opportunity to tell us your initial thoughts on desired improvements at each park as we begin this project. Please complete this survey by April 14th. Note you should also plan to take the public survey as well.



XIII. PROPOSED ACTION PLAN

Introduction

The action plan of a Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan consists of a series of actions that, when implemented, will meet existing and future recreational needs of the county identified in the needs analysis, while maintaining the quality of the environment. An Action Plan is typically divided into two categories: (1) County-wide recommendations; and (2) Specific capital improvements. The county-wide recommendations can be implemented by the county, local municipalities, school districts, or nonprofit conservation corporations. Capital improvements to individual parks or forest recreation areas are usually implemented by the agency that has jurisdiction over that particular unit.

County-wide recommendations consist of actions that affect the entire county. These recommendations include: staffing recommendations, policy and administration recommendations, land acquisition recommendations, and programs that affect the entire recreation system (such as maintenance policy and revenue policy).

Capital improvements are defined as improvements that have a value over \$25,000 and a service life of more than seven years. Capital improvements include any buildings or land, regardless of value, and all new programs with an initial cost of more than \$25,000. Examples of capital improvements include structures, roads, trails, land, etc.

The capital improvement program for each park or forest recreation area is a combination of several types of projects. Generally speaking, capital improvements are ranked in the following manner:

- 1. Improvements to existing facilities:
 - A. Correct health and safety hazards.
 - B. Upgrade deficient facilities.
 - C. Modernize outdated facilities.
- 2. Install facilities as deemed appropriate through community response (public hearing, survey results).
- 3. Install new facilities as deemed necessary by the Park or Forestry Department.
- 4. Install new facilities as deemed necessary through comparison to community standard and NRPA park and recreation standards.

Specifically, improvements to existing facilities will rank the highest in the capital improvements program, while new facilities are usually ranked lower, according to their relative need in the park or forest recreation area. Improvements that correct health and/or safety hazards are always the highest priority. Improvements that are deemed necessary through comparison to park and recreation standards only are usually ranked the lower.






